CNA CERTIFICATION

The Canadian Nurses Association's (CNA) certification program offers the only bilingual, nationally recognized nursing specialty credential. Being CNA certified shows that you're committed to an advanced standard of professional competence and have a comprehensive understanding of your nursing specialty.

Initial eligibility

If you're an RN or NP with at least two years' experience (3,900 hours) within the last five years in one of the 21 specialties and endorsed by a supervisor, you are eligible to become CNA certified. RNs and NPs from all domains — clinical, education, administration, research and policy — are welcome to apply. Candidates for certification must pass a computer-based exam.
